Broom Street Theater at St. Francis House: 1970-75

An article in the Capital Times March 4, 1975 announced the end of BST's relationship with St. Francis house as of June 15th. The article noted that BST had been at St. Francis house since June, 1970 on a "temporary" basis but now will be on its own. The March 7th event would be a fund raiser for locating and improving a new space.
